Junior Infants Immunisations: A reminder to parents of Junior Infant children that HSE nurses will be in school on Wednesday 17th December to administer the 4-in-1 vaccine to those children who returned completed consent forms to the office. On the day of vaccination children are asked to wear short sleeves and loose fitting tops and to have eaten breakfast. Very occasionally a child's parents may need to be contacted to collect them from school. If you have any concerns regarding a possible adverse event in the period post-vaccination you may contact the School Immunisation Office on 042 9381259 during office hours.
